Required Summer Reading for Incoming Brookfield First Graders—2020 / 2021

Developing a solid phonics base is essential to becoming a confident and fluent reader and writer. In first grade, phonics / spelling rules and patterns are a major focus, and serve as the building blocks for future academic success.

Children with a strong command of phonics / spelling patterns and rules are able to read and write words they've never read or written before. For example, if a child knows that two vowels next to each other (vowel digraphs) make one sound, he or she can spell brain, leaf, stream, boat, as well as countless other real and nonsense words (like zoat or yeak), that he or she has never seen on a weekly spelling list.

Across the first-grade curriculum and throughout the school year, phonics and spelling rules and patterns are taught and reviewed, resulting in more confident, happy, and fluent readers and writers.
